"Music Coll was a rare and valuable opportunity for us to have so much time in such a productive environment, and we learnt so much about what it means to play in a string quartet during our time there. Being in a beautiful and remote location really sharpened our focus and the input we received from the world class tutors brought our playing to a new level. Before we went to Coll, our rehearsals were not always as efficient as they could be! However, since the course we have felt more productive and motivated in rehearsals, and we are performing with more power in our sound and spontaneity which we didn't know we were capable of. Another highlight of the course was the folk music night at the Coll Holl pub, where locals brought their instruments and jammed together. They encouraged us to join in and we enjoyed it so much!

When we were not playing music, we were either eating delicious food prepared by the lovely Alison and her team, playing table tennis (and taking it way too seriously) in the main hall at An Cridhe, or outside exploring the beautiful island. We enjoyed going on walks to admire the many sheep, and the brave amongst even enjoyed a few swims in the cold waters of the Hebrides...

"The Kyans had the most wonderful time on the Tunnell Trust's Music Coll course. We had just started a sizeable chunk of substantially challenging repertoire: Beethoven's second Razumovsky quartet, Bartók's third, and Haydn Op.76 No.6. The format, the environment and tutors all gave us the perfect formula to tackle this three-course feast head-on, without feeling daunted by the mountain of music.

We had agency to schedule each day as best fit us, with Jonathan, Scott and Ralph all being fantastically flexible and supportive, imparting their wisdom throughout.

We particularly appreciated the concert format. Sharing each performance with both of the other chamber groups and playing one piece in each, not only allowed the audience a broad spectrum of music and approaches but also meant we weren't overwhelmed by the repertoire, as this was the first time that we had performed each piece. It felt particularly special to connect with the (primarily) local audience - it is such a rarity to be able to bring the joy of chamber music to such a remote location as Coll.

We left Coll with hearts full, and stomachs full of Alison's delicious cooking, and would absolutely love to be back again. Coll was an incredibly enriching experience, and we cannot recommend it enough to any young chamber group."
